HOMETOWN HIGHLIGHT: CARNAVALES PANAMA

Prior to Ash Wednesday, the Carnivals of Panama are held for four days in a row ending at the close of February. The burial of the sardine on Wednesday at 6 a.m., brings the Panamanian festival to a close. The coronation of the Carnival Queen kicks off the Panamanian carnival festivities on Friday night. Beginning on Saturday morning, "mojaderas" or "culecos" are held in public or private squares. Accompanied by popular music, tank trucks are brought in to spray river water during the day as part of the art of the afternoon. At night, there are numerous parades with queens dressed in carnival costumes aboard allegorical cars. Accompanied by troupes and tubas, squares are blocked and run parallel to the parade. Excitingly, the Capital City commemorated the 100th anniversary of these carnivals in 1910.

Black History Month

This month we not only celebrate Valentine's Day but also Black History Month! First celebrated as "Negro History Week," Black History Month began in 1926 when historian Carter G. Woodsen dedicated the second week of February to the cause. He picked this week because it coincides with Abraham Lincoln and Fredrick Douglass' birthdays; a perfect time to reflect on black history as black communities had already come together to celebrate both these days! Around 1970, black educators/black united students proposed Black History Month. It wasn't till 1976 that President Gerald Ford recognized it and instructed Americans to observe the month. In 1870 the first Black man, Hiram Rhodes Revels was elected to the U.S Senate and represented the state of Mississippi. Around the 20th century, leaders unified and developed a civil rights organization, the NAACP. Rosa Parks helped raise a voice about the civil rights movement from her bus boycott. In 1947, Jackie Robinson became the first African-American to play in the modern MLB for the Brooklyn Dodgers. Another inspirational figure was Thurgood Marshall, who became the first African-American to serve on the U.S Supreme Court. Shirly Chisholm was the first African- American woman in the House of Representatives in 1968. The first Black president of the United States, Barack Obama, was elected in 2008. More and more countries are joining the United States in celebrating black people and their contributions to the world's history and culture, including Canada, the

Statistics on the Heart:

- Cardiovascular disease is the number 1 cause of death worldwide.
- Every **36 seconds** a person dies due to heart problems.
- 659,000 people in the United States die from heart disease yearly, resulting in 1 out of every 4 deaths.
- In the United States alone, a heart attack occurs every 40 seconds.
- Approximately **6,300 children under the age of 18** experience cardiac arrest outside of hospitals.
- An estimated **17.6 million** people died due to cardiovascular disease alone in 2019.

Heart Healthy Tips for Teens

- Look for healthy food alternatives (balance is key)
- Learn ways to manage stress and find healthy coping mechanisms.
- Get enough rest and try to get 8-10 hours of sleep.

INGRIDIENTS

350g of flour 200g of butter I egg white

Tablespoon Lemon Juice

I SALT PIZZA

I JAR OF RASPBERRY JAM

Tablespoon icing sugai

INSTRUCTIONS

- IN A LARGE BOWL, MIX THE SOFTENED BUTTER WITH THE SUGAR AND ADD THE EGG WHITE JUICE, SALT AND FLOUR.
- Knead with your hands until you get a soft dough. Put it in the fridge and let it rest for half an hour.
- ROLL OUT THE DOUGH ON A SMOOTH FLOURED SURFACE TO A THICKNESS OF 4MM. AND CUT DISCS OF 5 OR 6 CM IN DIAMETER
- In the middle of the disks, we make a hole with a small heart shaped cookie cutter or a small knife.
- \bullet Cook the cookies in the oven, preheated to 210°C and cook for 10-12 minutes.
- They should hardly brown. We repeat the operation until the dough is finished.
- Remove the cookies from the oven and let them cool
- COVER THE COOKIES WITHOUT HOLES WITH JAM AND PLACE THE HOLEY COOKIE ON TOP.
- Sprinkle with icing sugar.

3 Ingredient Valentines Day Chocolate Truffles

Recipe:

Serving Size: 12 Truffles

Ingredients:

- 1 Can of Condensed Milk
- 2 Tablespoons of Butter, plus more for greasing
- 1/3 Cup of Cocoa Powder

Instructions:

- Put a pot on a medium low heat and melt the butter with the condensed milk.
- Stir in the cocoa powder and continue to stir for 10-15 minutes until the mixture begins to pull away from the edge of the pot.
- It's done when you run the spoon through the centre of the mixture and it takes a few seconds to combine again.
- Spread the mixture onto a buttered plate and refrigerate for 2 hours.
- When set, roll the mixture into balls, and sift cocoa powder on the top of each ball.
