Finally, 50% of students at IVLA who participated in this month's poll live in North America.





Ingredients

- 12 ounces semisweet chocolate chips or chopped
- 16 ounces white chocolate chips or chopped white chocolate

Method

- Place the chocolate in the idge for 15 minutes to solate the white chocolate.
- chips in a medium bowl and microwave for 30 second ncrements until melted. Add the peppermint extract and stir until smooth.

 Spread the white chocolate over the semisweet chocolate layer. Top with candy canes. Let harden in the fridge for about 20 minutes, then break into pieces and serve.
