International Virtual Learning Academy (IVLA) is a fully accredited, NCAA approved private school for students in kindergarten through grade twelve. IVLA is accredited by Cognia in the United States of America and is available to students in the U.S. and internationally who are seeking a flexible U.S. education and diploma. Our students meet their educational goals and grow academically with the support of fully certified and caring online teachers.

Since our establishment in 2007, IVLA has been the school of choice for the college prep student or any student looking for a self-paced option. Our student body is represented by more than 50 countries. We understand that students have different needs, academic goals, and abilities. As such, at IVLA we strive to meet the needs of every student exactly where they are.

International Virtual Learning Academy's online high school offers more than 2,000 challenging and diverse courses. Each semester-long course earns 0.5 credits, and students have 5 months to complete the course. Each year-long course earns 1.0 credit, and students have 10 months to complete the course. Full-time students spend anywhere between 3-5 hours a day working both on and offline.

With rolling enrollment, IVLA provides students the opportunity to enroll or re-enroll at any time. Students are provided with the flexibility they need to thrive. 
